

St. Luke's Charity was founded in 1872 and operates under the patronage of the Church of Ireland and the main Protestant churches in Cork. It provides nursing, healthcare and outreach services for the benefit of the community. Its subsidiary, St Luke's Home, operates a 128-bed long-stay nursing home on the shores of Loughmahon in Cork. This provides long-term residential care and day care services for older people including specialist dementia and Alzheimer care. The Charity also runs a dedicated Education and Research Centre (Northridge House) which offers support to the healthcare sector generally. In addition, St Luke's Charity Foundation raises funds to enhance the services provided. The organisation directly employs more than 160 staff.

### THE ROLE:

The Charity is seeking a highly motivated and experienced leader. Reporting to the chairperson and to the board of directors, the person appointed will have the necessary skills and experience to lead, energise, inspire and further develop a strong management team. The person we are seeking should have a proven leadership and organisational management and development record at a senior level and be an effective communicator and influencer. The individual should be capable of developing all aspects of the organisation whilst maintaining the ethos and work of the Charity.

Knowledge of the not-for-profit sector, relevant legislation and regulation and government funding procedures would be an advantage.
